Reasonable adjustments to the Behaviour for Learning Policy – Covid 19

Sept 2020

All children will still be required to adhere to the normal rules of the school.

If a child behaves in any way which is deemed to put either themselves, another child or an adult at a health risk, they will be sent home.

If a child reaches 'Senior Management' on the behaviour scale, they will not be sent out of their 'bubble' but they will have a sanction in their bubble – this will be decided by the teacher, but it could mean that child will not be able to participate in break or lunchtime activities, or whole group rewards for the week. Senior Management will be informed on the day, and a record will be kept. The parent/carer will be informed that day. If a second incident occurs in the same day, the parent/carer will be called to collect the child. The senior leadership will have an online meeting or phone call with the parent/carer and instigate a behaviour contract for that child.

Where a child has a specific behavioural need, this will be met in class with the appropriate provision and support where applicable. We realise that some children will find the new measures in place extremely stressful, and therefore individual risk assessments will be put in place to ascertain if school is the appropriate provision for them at this time. All reasonable endeavours will then be put in place to meet their needs at home.

Movement around the school

All pupils, parents and staff will be expected to adhere to the social distancing measures in place. This will be explained to all staff, pupils and parents. Failure to comply with this may result in a disciplinary matter for staff; a 'site ban' for parents or for a child to be collected from the setting for a given amount of time (as decided by the senior leadership team).

Children and parents must agree that for their child to be in school, they will be in small bubbles to reduce the risk of passing on Covid 19 to others. Children must stay in the classroom, toilet and outside space for their 'bubble'. Break and lunchtimes will also reflect this, and children will not be able to socialise with their peers who are in a different bubble to themselves.

Hygiene

All children will be taught the school's expectations around personal hygiene. They will be reminded to:

- Wash hands frequently
- Sneeze/cough into a tissue following 'catch it, bin it, kill it' - tissues will be disposed of in classroom lidded bins
- Use the crook of the elbow to cough/clear throats/yawn
- Not touch their faces
- Tell an adult if they feel unwell
- Use their own equipment in class and not touch things unnecessarily
- Only use their allocated toilets for their bubble

If a child coughs or spits at another child or member of staff on purpose, this could result in an exclusion from school.

If a child deliberately touches another person to cause upset and potential harm, they could also be excluded.
